

MISS MAUD MCKNIGHT LINDSAY

Since 1898 Miss Lindsay has been principal of the Florence Free Kindergarden. Although her service here have been interrupted by other activities during the period she arduous labor and unselfish devotion to the institution are too well known to require extended mention. Miss Lindsay is also author of distinction in the field of children literature.

Maud McKnight Lindsay was born in Tuscumbia, Alabama. She was the daughter of Robert Burns Lindsay and Sarah Miller Lindsay. She attended Deshler Female Institute in Tuscumbia for five years. She had kindergarten training under Miss Jeanne Petteet Cooper in Tuscumbia. Miss Lindsay was a teacher in private kindergarten in Tuscumbia from 1896 to 1898, and principal of Florence Free Kindergarten in Alabama from 1898 to the present.

She is the author of Mother Stories in 1905, A Story Garden For Little Children in 1913. She also wrote Story Teller For Little Children in 1915, and The Joyous Traveler (with Anne Emille Poulsson) in 1921.

Miss Lindsay's latest book, Little Missie, was published last year.
